A 2+2 pathway offers students the opportunity to complete the first half of a bachelor's degree program at SLCC. After earning an associate degree at SLCC, students seamlessly transfer to a partnering university to complete the second half of the chosen pathway, leading to their bachelor's degree. This degree plan is an academic planning resource to guide students on a 2+2 path to allow students to complete the Associate of Science in Criminal Justice at SLCC and transfer credit hours applied for partial fulfillment of degree requirements for the Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice at Nicholls State University. The college reserves the right to change, modify, or alter this resource without notice. The college strongly encourages students to consult their advisors for questions regarding degree completion.

A grade of "C" or higher is required in all courses.

NOTES:

¹ Choose from Fine Arts (ARTS) except ARTS 1010, or MUSC 1010, MUSC 1020, MUSC 2300 or MUSC 2310, or THEA 1010.

² All credits for SFSE 1003 transfer to Nicholls; however, only 1 credit is needed to satisfy degree requirements.

³ A total of nine credits in Natural Sciences are required for the bachelor's degree at Nicholls. Courses from both the biological and physical sciences must be taken to fulfill the natural science requirement. Six credits of science must be in a single discipline and three credits must be in a discipline not selected for the six credits. (e.g., Six credits of biology and three credits of chemistry; or, six credits of geology and three hours of biology, etc.) Labs are not required. PHYS 1060, Introduction to Astronomy I, transfers to Nicholls as ASTR 101. Students who take PHYS 1060 should then take six credits of biology to complete science requirements for the bachelor's degree at Nicholls.

⁴ Choose from CMNC 2050; or History (HIST); or ENGL Literature (ENGL 2XXX) except ENGL 2045, ENGL 2070, ENGL 2090 or ENGL 2240. No more than six credits should be from the same discipline.

⁵ Choose one course from or one course from HIST 1040, HIST 1041, HIST 2010, HIST 2020; or Natural/Physical Science (See note 3); or MCIS 1005; or POLI 1100; or SPCH 1200; or English (ENGL 2XXX) except 2045, 2070, 2090, or 2240.

⁶ Choose an additional course from footnote 4 in an area different from that chosen for the previous elective.
