
Anatomy of a Degree Plan

A degree plan is a list of courses and requirements that are specific to a program.

A degree audit is a review of the degree plan to determine a student's qualification for degree completion.



Degree Plan Tips

COURSES

Courses numbered below 1000 are not applicable.

Check for repeated courses. Use the highest grade earned.

Check for **mutually-exclusive courses** (i.e., different course numbers but similar content). Credit is earned for **only 1**:

• CMCN 2213 and SPCH 1020

• ECON 2010 and ECON 2020

• ECON 2010 and ECON 2030

• ECON 2020 and ECON 2040

• MATH 1100 and MATH 1105

 SFSE 1003, SFSE 1002, CCFS 1003, and COLS 1001

- ACCT 2101 and ACCT 2103
- ACCT 2102 and ACCT 2103
- ARTS 1010 and DGMD 1100
- ARTS 1140 and DGMD 1140

- BIOL 1000 and BIOL 1010
- BIOL 1002 and BIOL 1020

CREDITS

Check for courses that may not award 3 credits.

- College seminars (e.g., SFSE 1002 = 2 credits)
- Labs (e.g., BIOL 1011 = 1 credit)
- Some maths and sciences (e.g., MATH 2210 =
- Transfer courses

Verify that a **minimum of 25% of the required credits** are earned at SLCC (e.g., For a 60-credit program, a minimum of 15 SLCC credits are required.).

CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING

CPL includes credit for standardized tests, military and police academy courses, and other nontraditional means.

Verify that a maximum of 1/3 of required credits for the major is earned through CPL.

Verify that a maximum of 50% of required credits for the degree is earned through CPL.
